

Travelling to Spain

Health control form

All persons travelling to Spain from another country (including children of any age, travellers in transit and residents in Spain returning home), must complete the Health Control Form associated with their trip. When travelling by air, this can be done via the WEB www.spth.gob.es or the APP, Spain Travel Health-SpTH (available for Android and iOS).

After completing the form, you will get a QR code that you will have to present both at the time of boarding and upon your arrival in Spain at the health controls.

At the present time it is not mandatory to present any form if the trip to Spain is by land.

EU Digital COVID Certificate

On 17 March 2021, the European Commission adopted a legislative proposal to create a digital certificate to facilitate the safe free movement of citizens in the EU during the COVID-19 pandemic. The EU Digital COVID Certificate (DCC) will be valid in all EU Member States and will be issued by the competent authorities of the EU countries.

COVID-19 certificates of vaccination, diagnostic tests or recovery issued by countries with which the EU has established equivalence will have the same status as an EU DCC. These countries can be consulted on the European Union (EU) website.

Other certificates

Passengers from third countries who meet the requirements to enter Spain, may travel by presenting any of the following certificates, as long as they meet the same conditions as the EU Digital COVID Certificate:

- a certificate of vaccination against COVID-19,
- a negative diagnostic test (NAAT or RAT) performed within 72h (NAAT) / 24h (RAT) of arrival,
- a certificate of recovery from COVID-19

If you come from a HIGH RISK country, at the health controls on arrival in Spain, you will be required your SpTH QR code together with a vaccination or recovery certificate and, in addition, a SARS-CoV-2 diagnostic test certificate with a negative result.





Should you need to have a PCR test while in Barcelona:

There is a laboratory 3-minute walking from the Hotel Catalonia Ramblas, where the meetings will be held. You can go without previous appointment or, should you prefer, the hotel can help you get in touch with the laboratory and schedule an appointment.
